The summer session will provide **36 hours of training**. Instruction will be by scholars and experienced Project Citizen practitioners. Participants will receive practical lessons, videos, and an array of supplemental resources.

Participant responsibilities will be:

- Attend and participate in all training sessions
- Teach the **Project Citizen Program**
- Engage students in developing a Project Citizen portfolio (*this will be addressed at the training*)
- Engage in the research aspect of the program by pre/post testing yourself and your students

Application Selection: There will be a panel made up of Middle States and New England Project Citizen State Coordinators who will review applications. Among the guidelines for acceptance are:

1. Be a High School or Middle School teacher in the Middle States or New England region
2. Be a high school teacher who can implement the PCRCP design and use Project Citizen
3. Be a teacher from a high needs' school or district, additional considerations for teachers with special populations of students

Time lines: Applications will close on **May 31, 2022** with notification by **June 7, 2022**.
